## A Healthy Spiritual Heart

his edition of the Josephite Queensland Quarterly Newsletter is issued in the month traditionally associated with the Feast of the Sacred Heart, which will be celebrated on 24 June. This liturgical feastday held great significance and special place in the hearts of both Mary MacKillop and Julian Tenison Woods. It is a feastday that brings to mind not only Christ's passion but also His passionate love for all humankind.



Many have tried to define the rich symbolism of the 'heart' over the years:

The heart is the locus of physical and spiritual being, and represents the central wisdom of feeling as opposed to the head-wisdom of reason (Cooper, 82). It is compassion and understanding, life-giving and complex.

In our own context we have seen much attention devoted to the need to actively look after the health of our physical hearts. While we no longer need to use the all-too-familiar Check In app or QR Code for sign-in to various venues, there are apps galore that have been designed to make things easier for us. Smart watches and smart phones have apps that record the steps we have clocked up during the day and keep us on track, as we make choices to maintain a healthier heart. Logos such as the now discontinued *Heart Foundation Tick of Approval* and the *Health Star Rating System* (from a half to five stars) remind us to quickly and easily compare the

nutritional value of similar products. The thinking has already been done for us. We make external choices on a daily basis, aimed at addressing our goal to maintain and look after our health in general and our heart health in particular.

However, how do we actually go about nurturing a healthy spiritual heart that connects us with the Divine and calls us to make personal internal choices that draw us into contemplation?

As Josephite Companions, we pray that our Companioning Spirit will *grace us with prayerful hearts,* in order to acknowledge and listen to that ongoing inner dialogue that reveals God's intentions and inspires us to make generous responses.

We pray also that we may be graced to *contemplate God's presence in creation*.

In our world today, there are very serious concerns about issues around climate change and environmental degradation that sit at the top of the list on global agendas. On a personal, communal and spiritual level, we are each called to make a response of the heart. We sift through facts, statistics and expert opinions on the health of our beloved creation and constantly seek interpretations that might help us to make a bigger contribution to preserving and restoring the life of our planet.

The German mystic, St Hildegard von Bingen, suggested, way back in the 12<sup>th</sup> Century, that we need to *take back our listening heart, because an interpreted world is not a home... It is a world that is interpreted for us by others.* She adds...

We shall awaken from our dullness and rise vigorously toward justice. If we fall in love with creation, deeper and deeper, we shall respond to its endangerment with passion.

The Strategic Plan 2022-2025, formulated during our meeting, explored various possibilities in terms of establishing ways to connect with each other as Josephite Companions.

It was envisioned that one such possibility might be the establishment of an online space for Josephite Companions to:

- engage in prayer and reflective dialogue about a range of selected texts/articles designed to nurture us on our spiritual journeys
- share and enjoy ideas in friendship and have a chat as Companions with likeminded interests
- explore options for engagement in service to meet needs as they arise in the regional group settings or elsewhere.

It was decided that *e-companioning* might be a good name for our online space using the Teams Meeting platform.

# Futuring the MacKillop Gate Ministry

ear Companions in Queensland

The Sisters of St Joseph have news to share about the next chapter in the story of our MacKillop Gate Ministry (The Blue Bags).

This ministry supports prisoners on release from correctional facilities across Queensland. It was the initiative of Sisters Chris Symonds, Margaret Robertson and Michele Shipperley. The ministry has grown and over the years made a huge difference to many prisoners as a tangible expression of care.

The Companions in Queensland have been willing partners and ministry supporters through donations, and in some places creating local arrange-

ments to supply local prisons/parole offices with goods and cards. Companions, Sisters and Schools in our Queensland Region have been generous with offerings of prayer, donations of goods to go in the bags, monetary donations and packing of the blue bags. The first 72 hours after release are vital for re-entry into society and the blue bags provide essential supports such as Transport Cards.

The founding Sisters, with grace and wisdom, have decided the time is right to step away from the active management of the ministry.

We explored the possibilities of finding another Mission-focused organisation to carry on our MacKillop Gate Ministry for prisoners being released.

Conversations with fellow Prison Chaplains and St Vincent de Paul colleagues explored shared understandings of the vulnerability of prisoners and respect for their dignity as people. We can now confirm that St Vincent de Paul, through the Western Diocese in Brisbane, will take on responsibility for the MacKillop Gate Ministry from 1 July 2022.

Our own St Mary MacKillop maxim to 'Never see a need ...' resonates well with St Vincent de Paul's commitment to 'Give a hand up'.

As a Region, and for the next five years, we will continue to budget for an annual ministry contribution to be paid to St Vincent de Paul. We will then review our ministry contribution. St Vincent de Paul will also seek necessary funding, as we have done from government and other sources. There will be ongoing opportunities for each of us to continue to contribute to the ministry through St Vincent de Paul.
