ew Year's Blessings to you all!

There is no doubt that Mary was kind. Those who knew her often used the word 'kind' to describe her. Mary could relate to the suffering of others as she had suffered much herself. Her heart went out particularly to the needy, poor people and to no-account children. She set about to alleviate their suffering, frequently going above and beyond what was expected.

Joan Chittister writes that those who receive the other with the open arms of God, do so because they have come to know that for all their emptiness, God has received them. She adds that it is necessary to



take in without reservation those whom the world casts out, because it is they who show us most clearly the face of the waiting God. (Joan Chittister, *Illuminated Life*)

Hospitality is the overflowing of a heart that has to share what it has received. Hospitality demands that the people you are serving and the people with whom you serve, are received into your heart. This happened in a beautiful way last year in September when the Josephite Companions offered hospitality to those who came to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the House of Prayer in Townsville. They did this because of their connection to the House which was founded by the Josephites in 1981.

In early February this year, the Townsville Josephite Companions and the House of Prayer Community united to farewell Sister Carmel. Carmel, along with others, was instrumental in establishing the House of Prayer all those years ago. Like St Mary MacKillop she listened to the whisperings of God in her heart. She recognised the needs of those who were hungry for prayer and a deep personal relationship with God. Like St Mary, she was spurred into action, and like St Mary, she trusted that God would provide.

There were many people present at her farewell liturgy in February, among them the Anglican Bishop of Townsville, a sign of how much Carmel is loved and appreciated. She served the Townsville community in a myriad of ways for over forty years. People of the West were truly grateful for her ministry to them. Once more Sr Carmel had seen a need and she responded generously. Together with a very special laywoman, they travelled long distances in the heat and dust. Like Mary MacKillop she went over and above what was expected. She made many friends in that part of the Diocese also and these friendships have endured.

I started going to the Bible group after the Mass and found all the people so welcoming and I wanted to join the welcoming community.

Qld Leadership Team Meeting


