SUMMER/ADVENT REFLECTION



Spend a few minutes reflecting on this painting.

Sit with Mary and Elizabeth and share the joy they are experiencing

Reflect on your own experience of motherhood, either your own or sharing the motherhood of someone else.

Let the words, thoughts arise in your heart.

Make them a prayer.

In the Spring copy of THE SWAG, the magazine of the National Council of Priests, Fr Ronald Rolheiser OMI, has an excellent article on *Carrying a Scandal Biblically*. He broadens out many ways in which we can do this. One is "We need to 'ponder' as Mary did."

He goes on to explain that to 'ponder' in the biblical sense, as Mary did, doesn't mean that she thought deep thoughts about them. To ponder in the biblical sense means to hold, carry and transform tension, so as to give it back in kind.

An image he uses is a water purifier which takes in all kinds of impurities with the water, but it holds the impurities inside itself and gives back only the pure water. Jesus models this for us in his life. He took in hatred, held it, transformed it and gave back love'; he took in betrayal and gave back forgiveness; he took in curses and gave back blessing. Or like Mary, standing at the foot of the Cross, who could do nothing, but hold the tension and to stand in silent strength, waiting until it could be transformed. There would have been other times when Mary had to 'ponder': the birth of her child; the prophecy of Simeon of a sword of sorrow; the words of the young Jesus; at the Cross; at the tomb.

During this time of Advent let us do our own pondering

- As Church—can I transform pain and scandal to forgiveness and healing?
- As a member of a family- can I transform bitterness into reconciliation; haste into peace
- As a member of a parish and local community-can I transform loss and hardship into mercy

It is my responsibility, as much as others, to bring mercy, peace and harmony into our world.

We can only do this with Jesus and Mary as our models and with the grace given to us. Advent can be a great time of grace as we prepare for Christmas.

Our Mantra for the weeks of Advent could be:

Come Lord Jesus, Come and be born in our hearts.

The Prayers of the Faithful and the Procession of gifts were combined with Sisters and Associates, either singly or together brimging up symbols of our life. Water, Candle, a Cross, a basket of food, recalling how the Sisters have been supported with practical gifts during these years; a copy of the Constitutions of the Sisters and the Manual of the Associates; a copy of the Logo for this year; and the emblems worn by Sisters and Associates as a witness to their commitment to Josephite life.

The Grandmas were there in their purple, Rural Australians for Refugees, Teachers for Refugees, Doctors for Refugees and many, many more. It was lovely to meet Sr Maria rsj with her banner, the first one raised at the State Library in Melbourne.

I speak to a lot of people in detention or who have been through Australia's detention system. It is not necessary to treat people in this way. I can see how harsh and harmful it is. I really worry about the long term effects both on the refugees and on our national psyche.
