The Camino from Sarria to Santiago Spain



This ancient walk became a metaphor for my life. How we walk the Camino and the challenges we face along the way reflects how we deal with things in life. There was the challenge of pushing through pain and tiredness almost every day. Another challenge was to remain positive even though the road was often steep... The challenge not to give way to thinking about things I couldn't change there and then. To try and remain in the present moment.

Lessons on trust, faith, love, relationships and surrender were all present on the Camino. For me it became a solitary walk in many ways. Even though I had times walked and

conversed with people often total strangers, there were times exist on this planet if we just I walked in solitude even when people were passing by and there were other conversations going on. The Camino takes on a life of its own. One tends to get caught up into this phenomena that has captured the hearts of many over the centuries.

As I walked I got into a rhythm of steps which then helped me keep up with others on the road and helped me to pray and think as the kms ticked by. Whenever I hear the phrase "communing with nature" now I have a real sense of what that means. We were serenaded by so many beautiful bird songs every step of the way. The rain didn't seem to deter them at all. They were a constant on the journey. Hearing the sound of the cuckoo for the first time was special. The beauty that surrounded me in the trees, the flowers the countryside, the little simple villages and the people in them was all gift. Making way for the farmers as they drove their stock along the same road that we walked gave me a

glimpse into how we can all move over a little so all can take their place.

I was constantly reminded that I was walking the same road as hundred of other pilgrims had done for centuries. Now and again I afforded myself the time and space in my thoughts just to wonder about some of those people and their stories, their hopes and their fears as they walked. I wondered what their motivation was way back then when the journey would have been tough. There was for me a feeling of being part of something bigger, something that continues to go on long after the walking has finished.

To summarise I guess I could put it this way. We must all walk our own journey. No one can do it for us. One can be carried at times when it is too hard to walk. Ultimately however one has to take each step to get to where one must go in life. At times we do it alone, other times we are surrounded by companions on the journey. Sometimes we are called on to lend a helping hand to someone in need, sometimes it is



ourselves who call for help. There is room for everyone in this wonderful world. It takes everyone to be aware of others and the need to make room for all as we walk together.

We only have to be aware of the beauty and the free gifts we are given each day as we breathe in the air that keeps us - Sr Pauline Dundon alive.
