context

*This section of Matthew's gospel
tells of Joseph's dilemma when
he learns that unfortunately
the astrologers from the East
went to Herod thinking that the
'new born heir' would be in his
family. Herod, prepared to go to
any lengths to keep his throne,
ordered a blanket killing of boy
babies in Bethlehem. Matthew*

*tells the reader that Joseph had advance notice through an angel. He took the family and fled
from his home in Bethlehem to Egypt. In this story Matthew is describing Jesus' beginnings in
Moses-like hues suggesting to the reader that Jesus will be a leader even greater than Moses.
Joseph is painted as the protector, the man with his ear to the ground, the one who risks
everything to save the lives of loved ones.*



listening *Matthew 2:1-3; 13-15; 19-23*

After Jesus' birth – which happened in Bethlehem of Judea, during the reign of Herod – astrologers from the East arrived in Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the newborn ruler of the Jews? We observed his star at its rising and have come to pay homage." At this news Herod became greatly disturbed, as did all of Jerusalem.

After the astrologers had left, the angel of God suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph with the command, "Get up, take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you otherwise. Herod is searching for the child to destroy him." Joseph got up, awakened Jesus and Mary, and they left that night for Egypt. They stayed there until the death of Herod, to fulfil what God had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I have called my Own."

After Herod's death, the angel of God appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt with the command, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and set out for the land of Israel. Those who had designs on the life of the child are dead."

Joseph got up, awakened Jesus and Mary, and they returned to the land of Israel. Joseph heard, however, that Archelaus had succeeded Herod as ruler of Judea, and Joseph was afraid to go back there. Instead, because of a warning received by Joseph in a dream, the family went to the region of Galilee. There they settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way, what was said through the prophets was fulfilled: "He will be called a Nazarene."
