The formal canonisation ceremony will take place in Rome on October 17 with thousands of pilgrims from Australia and many from NZ planning to attend. along with church leaders.

A press release from Sr Anne Derwin, Congregational Leader of the Sisters of St Joseph reads "It is my hope that Mary's example will continue to inspire many todav. especially our young people, to live with the same deep faith in God, the same hope and the same selfless charity. Mary MacKillop was a hold and pioneering woman. To her all people were equal. To her all people deserved a fair go....Mary MacKillop is a relevant model of holiness and service for all of us We look forward to celebrating this in Rome, and

throughout Australia. New Zealand and beyond later this vear."

It is our hope that there will be celebratory services in each diocese of New Zealand to give everyone the opportunity honour this 'ordinary woman who did extraordinary things'. I hope that you will all be able to celebrate this historic occasion with other Associates and friends throughout the year.






### Happy Feast of St Joseph
