

On the 21<sup>st</sup> February we were privileged to have Sr Ursula Hoile rsj speak to us of her time as part of the Josephite ministry in Peru, which continues to this day. She had us laughing and crying with tales of her time living with and supporting the people of Peru, in particular of

her time helping prison inmates.



Sr Ursula expressed how happy the people were and how they were supportive and helpful toward each other within their own communities.



Sr Ursula described to us, in her factual and entertaining way, the life of the people in Peru; encouraging them to believe in themselves and helping them to develop initiatives in the support of their communities. One could not help but be in awe of the life that Sr Ursula, and the Sisters that were with her, lived at this time. Her photographs of the starkness of the country and the simple dwellings in which people lived (and still live) made one feel that we are indeed very lucky to live in Australia.

Over lunch we were able to purchase some genuine Peruvian products. The sale of such goods goes to help sustain Peruvians within their local communities.


### **'Sainthood in Midst of the Ordinary'**

# Penola and Mary MacKillop

Growing up in a small country town with my mum, dad, three older sisters and a younger brother, I shared a happy and contented childhood. We did not have a convent school in our town but my parents, particularly my mother, had a wonderful trust in God and in prayer. They and the older ladies of the parish instructed us in the Catholic faith and I pay tribute to these good people for what they gave me and my siblings.



At the age of 16 I started work as a Junior Teacher in Laura, South Australia prior to attending Teachers Training College in Adelaide in 1945 – 46.

In 1950 I was appointed to Penola Primary School in the south-east of SA and here I attended St Joseph's Church, meeting my first group of Sisters of St Joseph. How blessed was I, and since then I have always loved these very dear and special ladies.

I married my late husband, Jim, in September 1951 and, over the years, we were blessed with a son and two daughters. How proud we were to send these children to St Joseph's, Penola now known as Mary MacKillop Memorial School. Our years connected with this school were wonderful.

Between 1970 – 75 I became very ill and as I was recovering, someone asked if I would speak on our local television station and tell the story of the old St Joseph's Hall, now known as the Woods-MacKillop Schoolhouse. I was quite embarrassed as I knew so little about the building or Mary MacKillop.

The late Sr Pat White rsj came to my rescue and over a period of 3 weeks taught me all she could. With help I am sure from Mary MacKillop, I did what was asked of me. From then on my health gradually improved and my love of the Mary MacKillop story grew.

As most of you would know, Mary MacKillop began teaching in a little old converted stable in January 1866; a significant fact considering Jesus was born in a stable. Prior to this, Mary taught in Winella Cottage for a short time and also used this home as living quarters. A fig tree and well, which Mary would have used for drinking water, are still there. In January 1867, Bishop Sheil blessed Mary and called her Sr Mary. Thus began the order of the Sisters of St Joseph.

At this time Fr Julian Tenison Woods took out a loan of £190 to build a stone schoolhouse for Mary (the Woods-MacKillop Schoolhouse). After the Sisters eventually left Penola this building was allowed to become very derelict over many years. One night our local district council took a vote and only one vote saved it from demolition. I am convinced Mary MacKillop voted too that night.

The schoolhouse was eventually restored by a group of dedicated and hardworking parishioners. Many have gone to their rest but I am sure having received their reward. It was then opened as a museum and once again a group of volunteers opened the doors each weekend. Without publicity the demand grew until we were then opening 7 days a week.

As the number of visitors increased we realised more space was needed and the new Mary MacKillop Centre, to remember Mary, was built. A display featuring Fr Woods was added and a lagoon and native garden surrounding the building recognises his love of God, nature and science. The displays in the old schoolhouse were also upgraded and this was opened to the public last year.

Having lived in Penola for over 50 years how could I not be immersed in the wonder of the Mary MacKillop story. I simply have to walk in these buildings and around the grounds to find peace, joy and very often tears.

Unfortunately, my husband became very ill. With sadness and a heavy heart we sold our home in Penola and moved to Prospect, in Adelaide. Sr Patricia Keane rsj welcomed us and allowed us to become part of her group who worked in exactly the same way as the volunteers in Penola.

I now love to go to Mass in the Chapel at Kensington and find the same peace and

joy there. Just walking around the grounds reminds me of the hymn "This is Holy Ground".

Being privileged to meet so many of the Sisters of St Joseph so often warms my heart.

I hope each and every one of you reading my very simple story can find that same peace, joy and even tears.

## Mary MacKillop



### A Woman With A Heart For Mission

**From the pen of Mary MacKillop:** Seek first the poorest and most neglected parts of God's vineyard. 1900

**Scripture:** The spirit of God is upon me, because God has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. *Luke 4:18*

**Reflection:** Mary MacKillop was devoted to the service of the poor. Her love for poor children knew no bounds. She established a Catholic school system for children who were isolated and in poor circumstances. She had a practical love for those who were poor and destitute setting up orphanages, refuges for the sick and elderly and visited those who were in prison. She welcomed those experiencing difficult situations and provided opportunities for those who were most vulnerable in the society of her time.

**From the life of Mary MacKillop:** Mary MacKillop had driven some miles in a snow storm, but her first wish was to visit the school. There was a poor little bare-footed and ragged boy standing in the class. Mary went straight to him, and putting her arms around him kissed him saying, "Ah Sister, these are the children I love."

**Pause for reflection:** In what way is God calling me to bring good news to those who are poor?

**Prayer:** God of love, your heart reaches out to those who are poor in our world. Open our eyes and ears to hear the cries of your people bound down by the injustices of this world. May we, like Mary MacKillop, respond in word and action to the struggling peoples of our world. Blessed Mary of the Cross, serving the neglected ones, pray for us.

**Action:** Today, reach out to someone in your neighbourhood who is in need.
