Canonisation celebrations will be held at St Stephen's Cathedral in Elizabeth Street, Brisbane commencing at 4.00 pm on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> October. The actual canonisation will be on Sky news and ABC 24 news from 6.00 pm. There will be entertainment and displays in the Francis Rush Centre and Cathedral grounds. The Cathedral building will be a place of prayer. There will be two big screen televisions set up for viewing the canonisation, one inside the cathedral and the other in the Cathedral grounds. You are all most welcome to this event.

- ABC's Compass program will have a special feature at 10.00 pm on 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> October
- A live web stream of the ceremony will be available complete with commentary from <a href="Sydney website">Sydney website</a> the <a href="XT3 social network">XT3 social network</a> site or the <a href="Mary MacKillop">Mary MacKillop</a> site. Groups might like to gather in homes, parish halls, or on big screen sites around Queensland.
- The Papal Basilica of St Paul's Outside the Walls has been confirmed as the venue for the Mass of Thanksgiving in Rome and will take place at 10.00 am Monday, October 18, with Cardinal George Pell as chief celebrant and many bishop and priest concelebrants from around the world. The Basilica was founded by the Roman Emperor Constantine over the burial place of St Paul. The size of the Basilica will mean that all Canonisation pilgrims will be accommodated in comfort. It is also a place where Mary herself would have visited during her time in Rome.
- The Mass of Thanksgiving is one of the three key events to be held in Rome.
  The first will be a Vigil celebration of Mary's life to be held on Saturday October
  16. Because of the number of Pilgrims two consecutive celebrations will be
  held at the Auditorium Conciliazione.
- Archbishop Philip Wilson tells us: "When Mary MacKillop is canonised in October this year she will be under the title of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. The cross is a very important part of the spirituality of Mary MacKillop" (Mary MacKillop Blog July 5).

# <u>Introducing Petra Milaudi - our New Core Group Member.</u>

Hi, my name is Petra and I have been a Josephite Associate for almost one year and in recent months have joined our Queensland Core Group by kind invitation of Sr Joan Finucane. It is a privilege to be a part of this community. I was born of Italian parents and did some of my schooling with the Sisters of Mercy. At an early age I felt called to be part of a religious community but life for me did not take the path that I thought it would. Over the years though, no matter where I was or what I was doing I found myself continually drawn to Religious Women and their ministry.

Throughout my life I have been actively involved in ministry, both formal and informal, starting (my beloved late mother told me) at the age of four years going to help the old lady up the street make the beds and visiting the man next door who had throat cancer and could not talk properly... She told me the other children in the street were afraid of Mr Robinson because of the noises he made, but I loved visiting him and talking with him.

My life has taken me on a journey of ministry in jail, nursing homes, the streets and in schools. Currently I am employed by Brisbane Catholic Education as a Campus Minister four days a week, the rest of my week is taken up ministering in other areas and caring for my sick father. My hobbies include reading, walking, cross stitch, quilling, and crocheting.

Being part of the Josephite Associates has given me the prayerful support and 'family' I have needed and longed for to enable me to continue ministering to the people often marginalised by our society.

In 2006 I was fortunate to spend time in Papua New Guinea and most recently (July 2010) I visited East Timor on a scholarship with Catholic Mission. Sadly, on both of these trips I was not fortunate enough to meet any Josephite Sisters but made connections with other congregations and the local people; listened to their stories and came home advocating for them in my community. I continue to build on my connections and nurture my relationship with these people. I hope to return to one or both of these places to undertake more ministry should the opportunity arise.

While journeying through my time of contemplation and discernment I did not actively search out the Josephite Charism yet somehow it found me. I was living it without knowing it and as I became more aware and knowledgeable in it and of it. (I am still learning) I felt a true sense of homecoming.

I thank Sister Brenda, Sister Genevieve and Sister Joan for their friendship and support. Also the many sisters from other congregations whom I have talked with and stay in contact with, and those who have helped me to more fully align myself with God's will.

Living a life, with Mary MacKillop, Joseph, and John the Baptist as role models, to be the hands of Jesus is a rich blessing, I look forward now to my time working with the Associate Core Group and meeting many of you at our various functions.
