The Spirit of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop and Year of the Priest **Fr Vincen**

The canonisation of Mary MacKillop as St Mary of the Cross took place on 17th October 2010. I saw many interviews of Maria Casey rsj, the Postulator, in the media. She impressed me by her account of the Canon Law process required to obtain church approval for Mary's canonisation. This encourages us to recognise like Mary MacKillop that our poverty identifies us with Jesus and the grace of his cross. I congratulate her and all who helped to achieve the decision of the church that Mary MacKillop achieved holiness of life to an extraordinary level.

I notice also that Archbishop Phillip Wilson of Adelaide, President of the Australian Bishops, made an apology to the Sisters of St Joseph over the wrongful excommunication, which was removed by Bishop Sheil in 1872, not long before his death. Sheila McCreanor rsj said, "Mary MacKillop set us an example as she did not hold grudges and while it was a very hard thing, she was shrewd enough to get good advice to know that the excommunication that was done was not valid."

In June 2009 Pope Benedict XVI put before the whole church the image of the priest as an icon or image of Christ and asked us to reflect on this sharing in Jesus' priestly ministry. The priest is asked to allow his life to be changed by God by accepting God's invitation to become like Jesus in personal holiness and pastoral care for all God's faithful: lay, religious and clergy. Jesus ministered to the first Pope, to the Twelve, to the religious leaders of the time, to lay people, and to people outside His community. There are no limits to the ministry of Jesus or that of His priests.

Priests teach us how to receive the salvation that Jesus has won for us when we hear God's living Word spoken to us. This word from God brings us faith in Him Who opens us up to receive the life-giving gift of His whole life, of His death and rising to life. Jesus asks His companions (lay, religious and priests) welcome into to their hearts His lifegiving Holy Spirit to empower them to bring Jesus to everyone in the whole world, particularly the needy.

The Associates make up the largest group of Christ's faithful called to bring to the world the vision of Jesus expressed



in the call of Mary and her sisters, Fr Julian Tenison Woods and all priests "to never see a need without doing something about it." Through her baptism and consecration to Christ, Mary saw the needs of the poor in the many divided States and communities in Australia and New Zealand. With Fr Julian Tenison Woods and her sisters, she did something about it.

My experience of the Sisters of St Joseph in the Lismore diocese at Woodburn, Bangalow, Byron Bay, Mullumbimby, South Murwillumbah, South Lismore, Alstonville, and with the Lochinvar Sisters at Wauchope and Port Macquarie was that the Sisters supported the priest personally in his ministry because all the Sisters seem to reflect faithfully, as a group, Mary's understanding of the Pope's and the Church's teaching of the spirituality of the priest. She leaves all of us a great legacy of a constant Baptismal grace we gain from our share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ to do what we can for those in need.
