DUNEDIN DIOCESE CELEBRATES THE CANONISATION

On Thursday 4th November Trish Clark and Denise Mitchell from the Dunedin Associates headed to Queenstown by bus to attend the celebrations in Arrowtown taking place over the weekend. On Friday, 153 children from St Joseph's School, Queenstown sang, danced and acted out the story of how St Mary of the Cross established the school in Arrowtown in 1897. St Patrick's Church in Arrowtown was packed out. On Saturday two groups of about 50 people, led by David Clark from the Arrowtown museum, went on

a tour of places of interest connected with St Mary of the Cross. The walk ended at St Mary MacKillop Cottage, where we were greeted by Margaret Hyland, dressed as St Mary, who welcomed everyone. The Lakes District Museum education officer, Angela Verry, acting as Sr Cecilia, conducted a class of children from St Josephs School, dressed as 1897 pupils, in reading, writing and arithmetic lessons, as well as prayer and good manners. For example the boys were told that young ladies should be served first! Tony Hanning from the Catholic Education Office, presented Margaret Hyland with a plaque in recognition of her work over the years in restoring the MacKillop Cottage, and also the great contribution she and her team had made to the canonization celebrations in Arrowtown.

Sunday Mass was the highlight of the weekend. The procession, which assembled outside the church, marched through Arrowtown, where many people were lining the streets. It was led by the Queenstown Highland Pipe Band, followed by Kevin Burdon carrying the St Mary of the Cross banner from the parish church. They were followed by 14 Sisters of St Joseph, including the Provincial Leader, Sr Colleen Keeble, all wearing their turquoise canonization scarves, Josephite Associates, and the many parishioners, friends and ex-pupils from all over the diocese. Bishop Colin Campbell, Fathers Tony Harrison, Maurice White and Michael Hill were joined on the march by representatives from other Christian churches in Queenstown and Arrowtown.



After Mass lunch was served, including a massive "Australasian" pavlova, made with 150 eggs and covered with cream and strawberries. It was just great to have a chance to mingle with the Sisters, who came from all over New Zealand and Australia, priests and many friends from the whole Diocese of Dunedin.

For myself, this was a once in a lifetime happening that has left me on a spiritual high! Thank you, dear God, for our St Mother Mary of the Cross MacKillop, our Australasian saint.

Denise and Trish also attended celebrations St St Peter Chanel Green Island, St Mary Star of the Sea Port Chalmers, St Mary MacKillop Balclutha, and Holy Name North Dunedin, where they were both pupils.

'St Mary MacKillop: Beneath a Cross of Stars' Picture book



This book is based on Andrew Chinn's song about Mary MacKillop, "A Cross of Stars". We sang the song at several of our Canonisation Thanksgiving Masses recently. Andrew invited me to write a narrative of Mary's life for the book. The artwork comes from primary school children in Catholic Schools across Australia and New Zealand, which have had a Josephite presence. Four NZ schools contributed. At the book launch, a group of children asked Sr Anne Derwin to present a signed copy of the book to Pope Benedict XVI when she was in Rome. Their wish became a reality!
