This morning as we gathered at Eucharist, for the First Sunday of Advent, we all heard those challenging words from Mark's Gospel:

'Stay Awake...we don't know the day nor the time.' Our Indian priest in reflecting, referred to his years in the Seminary, which was over TWO days travel from his home town, with the restriction imposed of *family visits* allowed <u>only</u> after *three* years away! His mother's words on his eventual return "My son, how long I have been *waiting* for you!"

That is what Advent is all about, waiting! Waiting for our God to be born, to be born among us! to be born in our families, our society, and once again in our hearts! We wait for so many things, for a bus; for a homecoming; for a visit; for a loved one - we humans are always waiting.
