

SR ELIZABETH MURPHY'S PLATINUM (70 YEARS) JUBILEE



An air of excitement pervaded at Margaret Hubery House on the Sunday afternoon of January 29th when family, Sisters, Associates, past pupils and friends of Sr Elizabeth gathered to celebrate her 70 years of Religious Profession.

Sr Pauline Morgan, WA Province Leader, welcomed the guests, some of whom came from interstate and even one from overseas. As the guests mingled they were invited to partake of the refreshments catered by, and attractively presented by Associate, Frank Carr.

Rita O'Connor spoke of the qualities of Mary (Sr Elizabeth), her eldest sister, that influenced the family over many years. One of Elizabeth's nieces told of the

great love that the nieces and nephews had of their Aunty Mary. Sr Joan spoke on behalf of the Sisters and reminisced about just some of the significant events of Elizabeth's life as a Sister of St Joseph

A very entertaining interlude followed the speakers. The past pupils, among whom were many Associates, of St Gertrude's College New Norcia where Sr Elizabeth had been Head Teacher for 17

years, recited two poems viz "Hist!" by C J Dennis and "Tarantella" by Hilaire Belloc. The influence of their teacher was evident, as in spite of the lapse of many years the correct rhythm and expression of the recital were remembered. Two hymns by Dom Moreno OSB, Sponsa Christi and Adore Te Devote, favourites of Sr Elizabeth, were sung most harmoniously.

Family and Sisters assisted Sr Elizabeth in cutting the Jubilee cake made and decorated by Sr Margaret Culhane. The cake was iced in the shape of a book, and words of congratulation and a quote from the Magnificat were inscribed on it.



In conclusion, Sr Eileen Lenihan from the Congregational Leadership Team asked those present to join her in a prayer of blessing for Elizabeth and her Sister Jubilarians in other parts of Australia and New Zealand.

The large number of guests present was a tribute to Sr Elizabeth. Her witness to a long life of dedicated service to God and God's people was still impacting on the people of today.

Helper pays tribute to those who helped her

Sister Margaret Culhane of the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart will be taking some time today to remember those she has helped and more importantly, she says, all those that have enabled her to carry out her humanitarian work in some of the world's most dangerous locations.

Sister Margaret entered the convent 17 years ago after two years as a primary school teacher.

She says her decision to enter the convent was "one of those mysterious things" which has given her many opportunities to help out in the community.

"I know I would not have had the opportunities if I hadn't chosen to be a Josephite," she said.

Sister Margaret has been awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia for her service to the international community, in particular refugees from Asia and Africa as well as services to women

and as an educator. She spent nearly five years in Africa helping people in refugee camps in Uganda and Kenya in the mid to late 1990s and more recently travelled to the Philippines and East Timor to help out.

Sister Margaret said she ultimately shared any recognition with those who have helped over the years.

"The reason why I accepted this award was to remember all the people I have worked with, it hasn't just been me, and they've also supported me with their prayers in dangerous situations," she said.

"You can't do this type of work, especially in a foreign country without the support back home."

AUSTRALIA DAY LINK TO MARY MACKILLOP

Three Sisters of Saint Joseph on this Australia Day received the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) awards.

Sister Maria Casey received hers for her service to the community as Postulator for the Canonisation of Mary MacKillop, and to the Catholic Church in Australia.

Sister Margaret Culhane of the Western Australian Province received her award for her service to the international community, particularly refugees from Asia and Africa, to women and as an educator.

Sister Mary Leahy from the New South Wales Province received her award for services to pastoral care as chaplain of the Stella Maris Apostleship of the Sea.

"Thank you and may God bless you," the grateful child told the stranger. Too shook up for words, the man simply watched the boy push his wheelchair-bound brother down the sidewalk towards their home.
