A Pioneer Associate!

On the 22nd November 2011, Ruth Margaret Hogan died peacefully at her daughter's home in Helensville. Ruth was in her 91st year and was one of the first associates in New Zealand.

For about 65 years she lived in Gisborne and in 1987 accompanied Sister Gertrude McGowan to Mary MacKillop Place, North Sydney, to attend the first gathering of St Joseph's Associates to be held. That was the one and only time she left New Zealand.

Ruth was the first leader of the Associate group in Gisborne and her deep faith and devotion to St Joseph and St Mary MacKillop was an inspiration to all.

When she resigned as leader in 2000, Ruth continued to attend meetings for as long as her health allowed it. When she shifted to Helensville about 2 and a half years ago she was sadly missed by her old friends.
