YEAR OF GRACE


We are all becoming more familiar with the presence of the logo not only within our church proper but within many publications at hand. For those not familiar with the symbolism it is as follows:

- * The halo incorporating a cross that surrounds the head of Jesus in Eastern iconography
- * The host used at Mass
- * The monstrance used in Eucharistic adoration
- * A link with the artistic tradition of our indigenous people
- * The earthen, ochre colours of Australia a diversity of peoples and cultures, gathered into one community
- * A star-burst
- * Light

FEASTDAY OF SAINT MARY OF THE CROSS MACKILLOP SAINT FOR AUSTRALIA 8TH AUGUST 2012

This special occasion began with the Eucharist celebrated by Father Tony Chiera – Josephite Associate - at the church of the Immaculate Conception, Dardanup, along with approximately two hundred students of Our Lady of Lourdes School attending again this year, leading the singing beautifully which included Mary MacKillop songs Our sincere thanks to Mr. Des Wilike and staff for their continuing participation on this special day. Among the many people present were Sisters of St Joseph, Denise Casey rsj, Pauline Dundon rsj and Sr Christine Clark pbvm. Father Tony captured the attention of all present with his delightful

homily on the life and work of St Mary of the Cross. He began by asking the children if they knew where the Southern Cross was and told them that Mary was also born under the Southern Cross, that she was a wonderful, caring, courageous young woman who responded to the needs of people of the day. She built schools, orphanages and places of refuge for the poor and needy, in general living out her principal of: "Never see a need without doing something about it".



Father Tony asked what the similarity was with Jesus and Mary MacKillop – Jesus was born in a stable and Mary's first school began in a stable in Penola, South Australia in 1866. He told the children that she was helped by people, with food and money when they saw the great work that Mary and the Sisters who joined her were doing.

Father Tony said that Mary is the first canonized Saint for Australia and that we are all becoming saints in our own way to God. The students and people were eagerly engaged in Father Tony's telling

of the story of Mary MacKillop, the children responding promptly to his questions even to anticipating his question on occasion, with 'hands up' before the question was finished!

Grateful thanks from our Josephite Associates S.W to Fr Tony and all who came to join us making this a special celebration in honour of our Saint for Australia and the World - Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Morning tea followed enjoying each other's company to bring to a happy conclusion this special Feastday for Australia.

DEATH OF SR ELIZABETH MURPHY RSJ


Scripture tells us that the life and death of each of us has an influence on others.
