Special News Alert from the Combined Meeting of the Central Josephite Associates and the Federation Affiliates...

The Leadership Team of each group met again in early June in Whanganui for a gathering that was facilitated by Mary Jackson Kay rc. As you will be aware through previous newsletters, a decision had been reached at earlier meetings to combine the Associates and Affiliates as one group. During this weekend the focus was of continuing the journey of that decision. There was definitely a unity among the participants and an enthusiasm for moving forward as one group.

We began the journey by acknowledging we were a new group and therefore needed a new name to go forward. Our discernment process resulted in a unanimous decision to call ourselves...

We felt this new name connected strongly with journeying together, hospitality, breaking bread and Eucharist.

After this we realized that the next step was to formulate a "Vision Statement". We were affirmed by the common thread of all the contributions from the group which truly reflected our Josephite Spirituality.

As part of our next steps we are planning to ensure that the history of our Associates and Affiliates since the mid 1980s to the present is acknowledged and recorded. We wish to include the background to our present decision, as we think that this will be very important to the understanding of many people connected to us. There are still a number of practical things to be worked out for our future together and we plan to meet again to discuss these issues in October of this year. 
A Loving Tribute
