# **IOSEPHITE COMPANIONS AOTEAROA LEADERSHIP MEETING**

In September the Josephite Companions leadership team met at Mount Saint Joseph's in Whanganui. This was the first time we had met following the Fusion of the two congregations and we began by the twelve of us attending a Parish Mass on the Saturday night where we were all warmly welcomed by Father Des Levins as "The Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart". We lay members of the committee basked in the reflected glory!!

Time was spent discussing matters arising from the International Associates meeting in Sydney which four of the team members attended.

There was discussion around a proposal to hold a series of "Roadshows" in various areas around the country in order to better inform members of the latest developments in the Josephite Companions movement.

It was hoped that in conjunction with the roadshow meetings for the Companions, the leadership team members would also have time to talk to school principals about the Josephite schools' network. This is an idea that schools founded by the Josephite Sisters might link together to identify with and strengthen the Josephite charism. The Junior Joeys movement for children might also be started in some schools. Pleasant Point and Temuka have already begun with this initiative.

The Associates/Companions resources were found a new home in the archives at Mt Saint Joseph from where they can be easily accessed.

Peta Lindstrom reported on the numbers of Companions in New Zealand currently. There are 67 newsletters emailed out and 38 are posted. These are mostly to prayer members. 22 groups also operate around the country and hold meetings around prayer, friendship and service. The total altogether is 366 members.

During this year 35 Principals from Auckland Schools visited Mary MacKillop Place in Sydney and held their conference there. It is hoped that the Hamilton Principals will do the same next year.

We talked about the problem of interesting younger members in the movement and ways of showing Parishes what JCA is about. This was also talked about extensively at the Conference in Sydney.

As usual with our meetings we spent time together in friendship and prayer as well as the formal discussion times. Our next gathering will be in March at Mt Saint Joseph's.

#### ROAD SHOW

November 2<sup>nd</sup> Feast of All Souls saw a group of Companions gather in Whangarei for the first of the "Roadshow Presentations". Unfortunately the Dargaville group were not able to join us on this occasion but it is hoped to catch up with them in the next round of visits. The Whangarei Companions, who include Fathers Damian and Thige from the Parish, were joined by Sister Win Fouhy rsj from Orewa for the day in the beautiful setting of St Francis Xavier's Catholic School.

Jane Gunson and Catherine Birt presented the story of how the formation of the Companions group

had developed over several years with discernment and help from a number of facilitators. They showed the power point that had been presented at the Conference in Sydney which gave the outline of what we in Aotearoa NZ were doing to live out the Charism.

Other information from the Associates Conference in Sydney was displayed including the history of the development of the movement which began in 1983 and has now been going for 30 years. The title "Being Josephite Associates in our ever- changing world" and

Some talk centred on the different ways of joining the melody today that have been developed by the Sisters and also on our aspirations for the future and the ways we find a spiritual home in the Companions movement.

We finished with a beautiful All Souls Day liturgy having been united in friendship and prayer with each other and all those who also live in the Josephite spirit.

### TRANSPACIFICO REGION

The Sisters are organized into 5 regions. The Associates and Companions belong to these too. The new regional group New Zealand belongs to is called Transpacifico. The sisters living in the local communities of Aotearoa New Zealand, Queensland and Peru belong to this region. Each region has a Regional leader assisted by several Councillors. These leaders and the central leadership team of the Congregation are elected at each Chapter. We are not sure exactly how this will impact on us as Companions, but we will be in contact with Associates from Queensland and Peru to consider how we might work together in the future.
