On Friday 18th March 2016, St Columba's Church and St Joseph's Convent South Perth came together as the venue for a shared celebration of the 150 years of Josephite life and ministry. The staff of Saint Columba's School, and in particular Ondine Komnick, the Assistant Principal, worked with Maree Riddler to prepare the children for this celebration.

A large number of Associates, friends, parishioners and parents of the children were present with the Sisters of Saint Joseph for this joyful celebration.




The Church was packed for the Mass at 10.00am. The celebrants were Monsignor Brian O'Loughlin and Fr Greg Donovan, and the children of St Columba's School sang like angels. The children also did the readings and prayers and carried appropriate symbols of their understanding of the journey that Mary and Julian began 150 years ago, a journey that has been embraced by many Sisters of Saint Joseph, Josephite Associates, Covenant Josephites and thousands of faithful followers and benefactors.

In his homily, Fr Greg Donovan, himself a Josephite Associate, spoke of his links with the Josephites over many years. He said he is proud of the Josephite Congregation in their offering sanctuary to asylum seekers. At present, Fr Greg is providing accommodation to an asylum seeker from Iran in his home.

After the Mass, the adults enjoyed morning tea and chat in

the Convent grounds, catching up with old friends. Later in the day, Maree Riddler visited all the classes at St Columba's to thank them and to give them each a memento of this special Day. - Sr Margaret Keane rsí

Centre on 12th March. On her way through Halls Creek she met up with Maria, a child health nurse, and invited her along to the day. What a woman! She lives in an isolated place as a nurse, facilitates the Church community and reaches out to the poor. She evangelizes by her actions and relations.

Breakfast in the Garden

South Perth, 12 March 2016



Since 2003 the WA Committee of the Mary MacKillop Foundation has held an annual BBQ Breakfast on the second Saturday in March. Over the years the event has been held under the banner of various names, *Breakfast in the Park* (Burswood), and more recently *Breakfast in the Garden* (the Convent grounds at South Perth). Different names – but always a breakfast!

In 2015 the continuity of this practice was hampered as gale force winds were forecasted with 100% certainty of extremely heavy rainfall throughout the day. The event was cancelled and the day arrived, hot and humid but no wind and no rain! In 2016 this break in continuity was a challenge for the committee as they approached the second weekend in March. Undeterred they pressed on. The weather was brilliant. Guests arrived on schedule around 8:00am and continued to pour in. The figures for the day suggest that there were 120 guests.

As the sun rose higher in the sky the colourful gazebos erected around the garden provided ample shade. This year an innovation to the tradition of the breakfast was the guest speakers. These were representatives from the two organisations that were successful in their bid for

funding during 2015. Chrystie Flint, the CEO of Swan City Youth Services and Peter Giliano, Chair of the Board for the Centre for Asylum-Seekers, Refugees and Detainees (CARAD) spoke about the work that the funding has enabled them to do. Chrystie's account of the amazing work being achieved through the *Taming the Inner Brumby* program held listeners spellbound. Peter's personal story threw light on the long term successes stories that emerge in the second and third generations of refugees who make Australia their home.

Old friends met up and chatted over their breakfast fare. New friends made themselves known and mixed with the 'old timers'. The raffle highlight was the Mary MacKillop toile bed quilt made by Marianne Lewis and won by Jacqui Mayne. Throughout the morning guests were served by students from Notre Dame University and Edith Cowan University. These generous students kept up the supply of food and beverages throughout the morning. All the members of the Mary MacKillop Foundation Committee worked tirelessly over a number of days to make the





event a success.

When all the guests had departed and the cleaning up done you would not have known there were more than 120 people enjoying themselves there only an hour ago – except for the band of workers who remained behind to clean up.



MARY'S PRAYER OF GENEROSITY

Mary MacKillop also had a strong devotion to John the Baptist. She well understood the occasion in John's life when he was asked by the priests and Levites from Jerusalem to identify himself, John replied:

I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

A voice of one that cries

Prepare a way for the Lord.

Make his paths straight!

Jn 1:23

This is an Advent stance and Mary seems to have identified with John's way of life. This is all she really wanted to be – one who prepares, one who wants to lead others towards God, to facilitate God's encounter with others especially those in need.

In her Book of instructions to the Sisters, recalling St John the Baptist, Mary encourages:

"We must trust to his wonderful light as a Patriarch and



Prophet, and pray earnestly for his spirit of penance".

The theologian, Walter Bruggeman, defines a 'prophet' in language which fits Mary's spirituality and describes the orientation of her life. Such a person "sees with different eyes and perceives the depth of what is really taking place, is not simply swayed by how others define that reality. She hears at a different pitch and feels with the heart of God."
