The Josephite spirit was obvious from the very first gathering with a buzz of friendly conversation. Katrina Brill rsj and Christina Neunzerling rsj were the conference facilitators. They were wonderfully inspiring - challenging us in a gentle, good humoured manner. We began by looking more deeply at the Josephite vision from the Sisters’ most recent General

Chapter, focusing on living into mystery and a new consciousness of communion. We reflected on where we find mystery in our lives and contemplated the meaning of communion with all creation. For many of us this involved seeing things in a completely different way.

We then looked at “Friendship, Service and Prayer” from this new perspective, contemplating what these might look like and how they may be experienced differently. Gathering in regional groups, we then planned some practical steps forward to take this new way of living the vision back to our Associate groups.



The IJALT team also shared with us their strategic planning and asked for feedback.

Having been nurtured and empowered, the gathering ended with a Missioning liturgy where we were sent out to participate in God’s flow of love, transformed to create the future within our local areas.

Breakfast in the Garden



March 11, 2017

Once again people poured through the gates at the convent in South Perth and it was clear that we were set for yet another great annual gathering of friends of the Mary MacKillop Foundation. There were the regular faces. Sadly with the passing of the years there are some absent faces. Happily there are also some new faces whom we welcome eagerly.

Preparation for the event involves the usual logistics of procuring, moving and setting up of barbeques, PA system and gazebos. All this is possible because of the generosity of St Columba's Catholic Primary School in South Perth and the manpower provided by volunteers from Notre Dame University in Fremantle. The students and staff at Notre Dame University give their time over two days to help make this event a success.



Breakfast in the Garden this year fell on March 11, the same day as the state election here in Western Australia. We have no way of knowing whether or not this had an impact on our event but in recent years we have become accustomed to approaching the day with concerns about the weather. Waking around 4:00 am to the noise of a massive wind and the sound of the leaves rustling in the trees similar to that of rain of falling, panic surged to the surface. Closer inspection revealed that the wind was an easterly and absolutely no sign of rain. From that point on things continued to improve.



We were blessed with wonderful weather, a magnificent group of people and two engaging speakers. Sr Julianne Murphy shared some of her experiences within the Warmun community and Ngalangangpum School. She described the impact of lack of literacy skills on the community's financial welfare and then outlined the hopes and aspirations for addressing this need through the Reading is Deadly program that is funded by the Mary MacKillop Foundation. Chrystie Flint from Swan City Youth Services spoke of the challenges facing her organisation as they seek to address the needs of marginalized urban youth. Her story of Jack as he completed the final challenge in the Taming the Inner Brumby program held everyone enthralled to the end. The image of Jack embracing his horse will stay with us all.

Throughout the morning guests were served by students from Notre Dame University and Edith Cowan University. These generous students kept up the supply of food and beverages throughout the morning. Meanwhile the two workers in the kitchen, Ali and Mark ensured that no one was kept waiting. Our two very capable B-B-Q chefs, John McCormack and Laurie Mayne worked tirelessly to make the event a success.



MESSAGE OF THE CROSS

The Holding Cross, which fits comfortably into our hand can give us hope and peace in the midst of pain and suffering. It is a symbol assuring us that we are not alone. Jesus has trodden this path before us and is with us still bringing us hope that suffering will be transformed into enduring life and love.

The cross is central to the mystery of the Christian life. Over time it has become the symbol of Jesus' triumph over suffering and death.

"The message of the cross is folly for those who do not believe but for those of us who are believers it is the power and wisdom of God" (1 Cor 1 : 18)

Mary MacKillop chose to be called "Sister Mary of the Cross". She wrote to her mother: 'My name in religion is Mary of the Cross. No name could be more dear to me.' 1867 She saw the cross as an expression of her commitment to God and her personal relationship to Jesus Christ. She spoke of walking with all those who were struggling and suffering in their lives and who needed hope and encouragement on the way.

As I hold the cross, God of Hope
Fill me with your strength and peace.

No matter how fearful I may be,
I know nothing can separate me from your love.

Be not afraid, I am with you always.
Help me to continue to believe in your loving presence
even when I don't feel you with me.

When persecutions or dangers threaten,


I quietly creep into its deep abyss,
