#### Autumn — Change (2018)

utumn is approaching. Soon the long, hot summer days will shorten and the temperature will begin to drop a little. If you live in an area where nature displays her autumn colours, you will experience the change from green to every hue of yellow, orange, fiery red and russet brown. Then the spent leaves will begin to fall and form a



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rich carpet underfoot to provide nutrients for the next burst of life. Autumn signals change, a time of

transition before the approach of winter.



We could protest that we don't want to change the warm and bright summer days for those shorter, colder and darker days of winter, but the seasonal cycle will occur in its due time whether we are ready to embrace it or not. Our God has designed and created our world with amazing skill and tenderness. Seasons follow each other in a never ending cycle of life. Summer dies to give way to autumn and then in turn winter will follow before the rebirth of spring.

Our lives also repeat this pattern of our Creator God. We experience the warmth and lushness of summer when our life is coasting along beautifully, followed by the less bright and colder times of autumn, when it is harder to find meaning in what we do or what happens in our life. Then there is the darkness and bitter cold of winter, where we might feel lost in a swirling mist and our God is far away from us. In due time the cycle continues again with the advent of spring in our lives and we feel again the closeness of the God who loves us. In fact, God was never apart from us, but close beside us in that journey. It was our perspective that moved. In the "transfiguration moments" of our lives, when we've climbed that mountain, soared above our human fears and frailties and experienced a tiny portion of the vision God has planned for us from the beginning, it's as if we begin to see and understand true reality. We don't want to come back down the mountain again. We want to keep savouring that ultimate closeness to the divine.

But once we have descended from the high mountain and back into the hurly burly of life, our humanity has a habit of allowing us to forget the vision. We put up the shutters again and block out the only true light. We want life to be comfortable again. We don't want

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to acknowledge the challenge of God's call. We resist God's challenge to be open to change and so we lose perspective.


Daniel O' Leary, a well known author and priest, tells a wonderful story about accepting and embracing the grace of awareness, the gift of being able to blend our hearts, mind and our work together in union with God.

He writes: "Two men were building a wall – long and high, one at each end. When asked what he was

doing, the first brickie replied that, for a start, he had no interest whatever in his work. A wall is a wall is a wall. He was bored and listless. Brick after brick, day after day, month after month. He longed for Fridays; he hated Mondays. With no interest or involvement, his work was slowly killing him.

'I'm creating a cathedral', murmured the other man. 'This is the south wall of it. I've seen the plans. It will be such a beautiful building. I can't believe I'm part of it. When I watch the young children playing around here, I can see them and their own children, worshipping in this holy and lovely place for the decades of their lives'."

In this graced season of Lent, when we are called to reflect, to repent, to embrace change, to prepare to rise again from the tomb with the resurrected Christ at Easter, which of these men's perspectives will guide you?



## FOOD FOR THOUGHT this Lenten Season...


A story of human kindness incorporating the word 'ubuntu', an African word meaning 'human kindness'

Ithough its meaning is much bigger in scope than that – it embodies the ideas of connection, community and mutual caring for all – something we want to concentrate on this Lent. It has also been translated as – 'I am because we are'.

At the Festival of Peace, the Journalist and Philosopher, Lia Diskin, related a beautiful and touching story of a tribe in Africa she called Ubuntu.

She explained how an anthropologist had been studying the habits and customs of this Tribe, and when he finished his work, had to wait for transportation that would take him to the airport to return home. He'd always been surrounded by the children of the tribe, so to help pass the time before he left, he proposed a game for the children to play.

He'd bought lots of candy and sweets in the city, so he put everything in a basket with a beautiful ribbon attached. He placed it under a solitary tree, and then he called the children together. He drew a line on the ground and explained that they should wait behind the line for his signal.
When he said 'Go' they should



When he said 'Go' they all unexpectedly held each other's hand and ran off towards the tree as a group. Once there, they simply shared the sweets with each other and happily ate them.

The Anthropologist was very surprised. He asked them why they had all gone together, especially if the first to arrive at the tree could have won everything in the basket – all the sweets.

A young girl simply replied, 'How can one of us be happy if all the others are sad?'

The Anthropologist was dumbfounded! For months and months he'd been studying the tribe, yet it was only now that he really understood their true essence.


The Townsville Associates are looking forward to being inspired by the Conference in May and hopefully expanding into other centres within the diocese in 2018.

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

The annual National Pilgrimage, 'In the Footsteps of Mary MacKillop', goes to many places associated with Mary's life and ministry. This is a unique opportunity to absorb some of the aspects of her life and appreciate anew her role as our Australian Saint.

The pilgrimage starts on 23 October in Melbourne, continues by coach to Portland, Penola and Adelaide and then by air to North Sydney concluding on Saturday 3 November. The cost ex Brisbane is \$3360 twin share. A single supplement is \$700. These costs include flights to Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane, motel and meal costs and all entry fees.
