My Travels to Timor Leste

Recently I had the opportunity to accompany Sr Margaret Cleary, Leader of the CentreWest Region, to visit Timor Leste. This was in response to an invitation from Sr Kathy Jennings who has worked throughout this year to support the development of Associates in Dili. In my time away I was fortunate to see the work of *Mary MacKillop International* (MMI) in action.

Education is in great need of support as the troubles of the past 40 years in Timor have left the country with low levels of literacy and many challenges. For many years MMI has supported the writing of reading materials in Tetum, the local language. Originally printed in Australia, now big books, readers and posters are all locally produced in Timor.

Teachers are brought into Dili for intensive training and then MMI staff go out to their schools and mentor the teachers in their practice. A Mobile Learning Centre travels around to schools, providing extra support with literacy and music, with the provision of musical instruments, books, puppets and the

like. To see the children really engaged in these activities was a great delight!

Another project of MMI is supporting parents to teach their pre-school aged children. Over many weeks the parents attend sessions at the MMI Centre where they learn to play with plasticine and use scissors to draw and cut out images, tasks which we take for granted but which are new experiences for these parents.

The dedication of the MMI staff, all of whom are Timorese, to this mission in the name of Mary MacKillop was evident. One of those who travel in the Mobile Learning Centre said to me in conversation one day, "Mary MacKillop wanted to help the poor. We therefore have to get to the schools in the mountains. Then we will really be doing Mary's work." Because of distance and isolation there is indeed a great need for educational support there.

I was truly blessed to have the opportunity to spend time in this beautiful country and to see that the spirit of Mary MacKillop is very much alive in Timor Leste.

Josephite Associates in Timor Leste

In 2008 a group of Timorese men and women were in Sydney for World Youth Day. During this time they learnt about the Josephite Associates and seventeen were inducted.

In October 2016 some from the original group asked if the Associates could be renewed as there were other people interested. Invitations were sent to come to a session in February this year to hear what the Josephite Associate Movement was all about. Much to my surprise over 20 people turned up!

Participation in a monthly formation program was explained to learn about the spirit and work of the Associates and also to learn to come together as a group. This program was based around the ideas of *friendship, prayer and service*. They were also introduced to being a group within their own parish who would work in 'mission' with whatever the priest felt was a need. Special emphasis was placed on the elderly, neglected and disabled.

Three parish groups have been formed and each of these groups meet monthly for prayer, planning of a "mission work" and a sharing of food. Four times a year the groups come together during the feast days of St Joseph, the Sacred Heart, Mary MacKillop and the

Immaculate Conception, which is a major feast day in Timor.

There was great excitement and a real feeling of deep joy one Sunday in October when four of the 'old' Associates renewed their commitment and twenty six became Josephite Associates for the first time. Sr Margaret Cleary and Mary Hemmings joined us for this ceremony. While Mary fastened the Associate badge on each new member, Sr Margaret gave them a certificate and I handed them a booklet, in the Tetum language, based on their formation program.

It has been a wonderful journey and we have a real sense of 'good' things ahead. Already there are others asking for a repeat of the formation program and it is great to see that both men and women have been attracted to the spirit of Mary MacKillop.

For me it is also marvellous to have many of the new Associates coming from the parish community. It is a whole new group being introduced to the spirit and teachings of Mary MacKillop. In her words: "Let St Joseph's true children remember their mission to seek first the poorest, most neglected parts of God's vineyard." (1900)

Mary MacKillop's Work Continues in Timor Leste by Lourencia

(Lourencia is a Josephite Associate in Timor Leste and also works for MMI)

Mary MacKillop was a woman who was strong in her faith. She fully committed her life to serving children and the poorest in Australia. She was a woman of compassion, justice and the dignity of every one was important to her.



Her life was an example of how to serve others with love and compassion. Mary MacKillop's work today continues through us in Timor Leste and the way we work with the people of our country using projects from Mary MacKillop International (MMI). Through MMI we also help co-workers continue the work in isolated communities.

MMI started its mission in Timor Leste through the request of Bishop Carlos Ximenes Belo in 1994. Bishop Belo asked the Josephite Sisters if they could help the people in Timor Leste to read and write in their own language so that the Tetum language would not be forgotten. This request has developed into four projects:

- Tetum Literacy
- Health Literacy
- Parent Education Program
- Mobile Learning Centre which includes music, puppets, reading and games.

Today MMI staff work with others in remote areas where there is a lot of need. MMI staff always remember the words of Mary MacKillop:

"Never see a need without doing something about it." (1867)

Mary MacKillop brought the message of human dignity to all whom she encountered. She held in reverence each person about whom she spoke even those who had caused her great pain.
