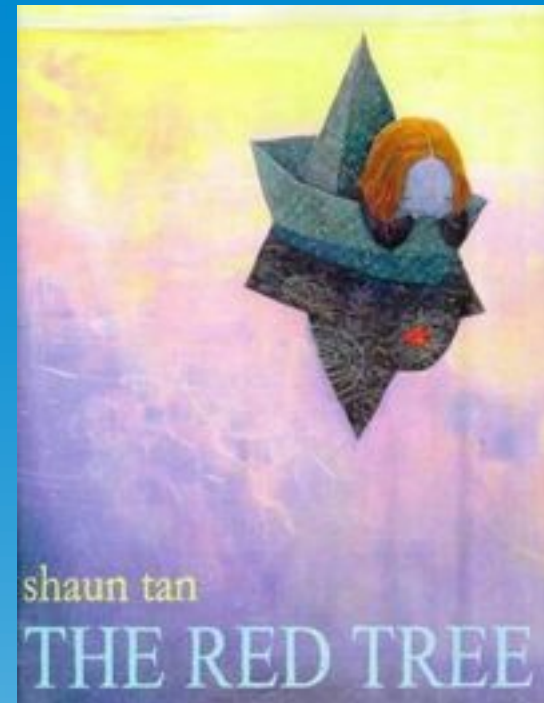

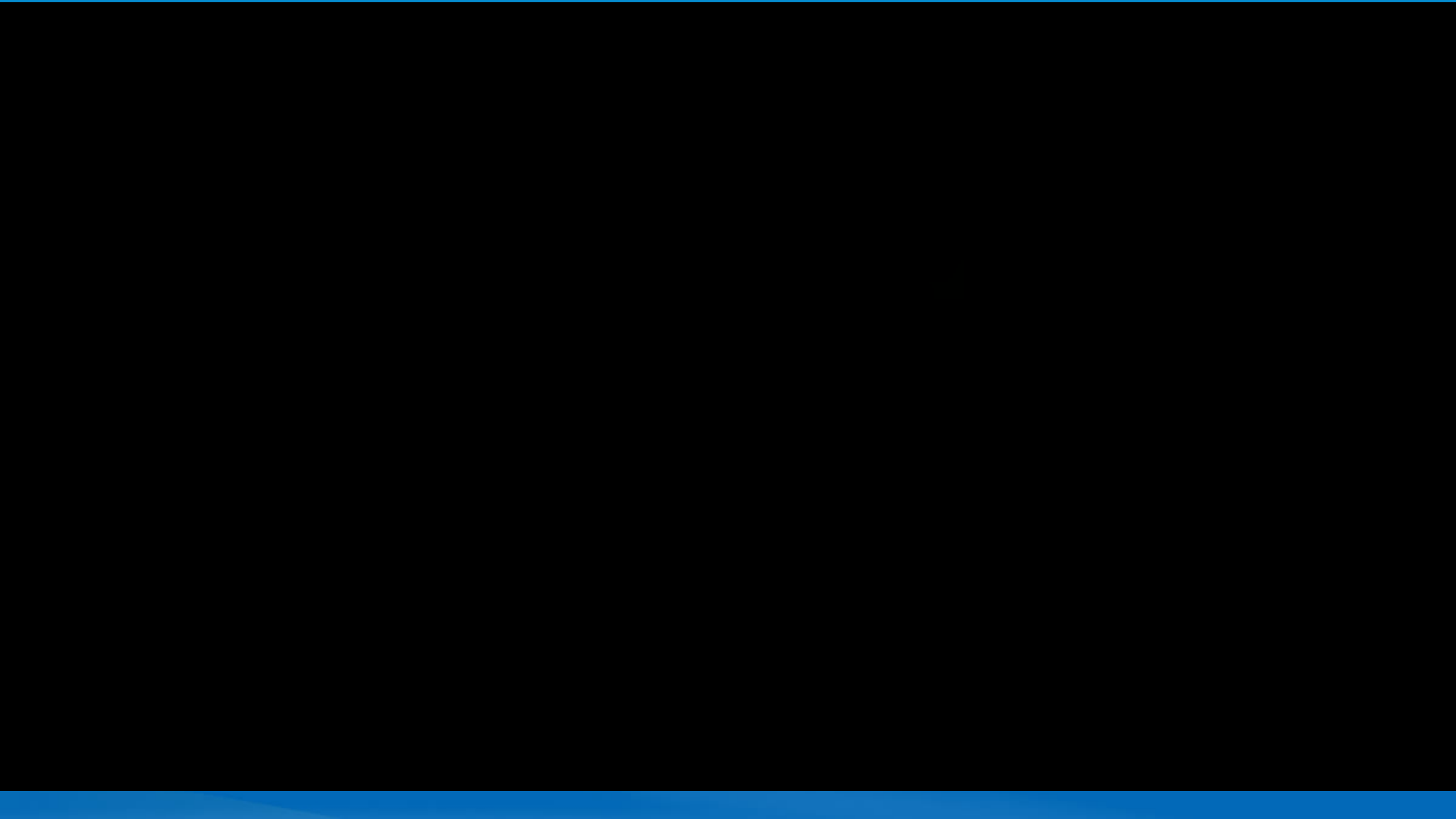
UNDERSTANDING

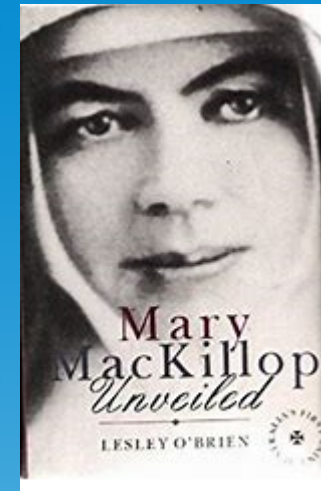
