During the last 4/5 months, being in "lockdown", I contacted an adoption firm in London to help me learn of my family background. I asked Associates for lots of prayers and sought help from our friend, Mary M. Unfortunately, my mother died in 1980 and sad to say, I never got to meet her, but I now have a half-sister, (to me she is my sister, and I do not bother about the half!) When I found out, I was so anxious as to whether I should contact her. My question was, What if she doesn't want to hear from me, or doesn't want to remember me?' Anyway I did......She remembered me being born, she was six years of age, and told me, she often wondered what happened to me. It's a long story, but she's so happy I contacted her, and we now talk regularly. I have an extended family, who treat me as one of their own and they are so pleased I made the search.

My mother was a Catholic and had me baptized at two weeks old. That tells me what kind of person she was.

I found so much solace in this. They took me through Lent and Easter. I found great pleasure in joining my friends from my homeland in Scotland, for the Holy Mass. As fate would have it, at the beginning of May I also found daily Rosary and Mass form the Carfin Grotto in Glasgow streaming online. Carfin is wonderful – it is a mini version of Lourdes. This really was the icing on the cake for me! Through this, I have rekindled some old friendships. I prayed daily for those who were affected emotionally by the Virus. I also thanked God for the happy times that I have experienced during this pandemic.

Prior to the Covid-19 lockdown the Core Group had decided that we should be represented in our local church community in any way, where we were to be seen serving the community following Mary's example in her community, giving service where it was needed especially to the sick and housebound. In my own life because of a disability I had given up service as a Eucharistic Minister at Mass after 25 years. However, I volunteered for taking the Holy Eucharist to the sick at home. Taking Holy Eucharist to the sick became more meaningful as my friend Maud became ill during the lockdown and once she was home it is with great joy my husband and I went to Mass and took the Holy Eucharist to her. Then we enjoyed a visit while we had a cuppa and a chat it gave the men time to talk and have a laugh. This, of late, has been a really happy hour as Maud's results have been positive.
