CREATIVE COURAGE

As participants in SOSJ Works, we accept that the value of Creative Courage will be our badge. It will be, as it was for Mary and Julian, the means of making life better for all in our midst.

As Julian recalled in his memoirs, whilst travelling his vast parish of Penola on horseback he dreamt of having Religious Sisters "who would live poorly and would go into remote parts of the colony and give proper religious instruction to poor scattered children". When Mary disclosed her desire to be a religious, he saw the potential of this dream becoming a reality.

Mary and Julian shared a vision which required every ounce of creativity and courage to become a reality. The establishment of the first Religious Order in Australia co-founded by an Australian and the use of an abandoned stable to birth their vision, are just some examples of their creative courage. Their words continue to inspire us.

The Creative Courage expected from us must come from our genuine desire to relieve suffering and bring hope. We must be so much a courageous presence that our corner of the planet becomes a better place because we are in it.
