Mary MacKillop's reverence for all people meant that she was incapable of giving up on anyone. The Sisters' memories of Mary reflect her deep respect for the dignity of all. To her, everyone was precious. One of the Sisters who knew Mary recalled:

If anyone came to her troubled or distressed she would encourage and help them and draw the good that was in them out.

An old eccentric gentleman whose hair and beard needed brushing came to one of the Sisters in Sydney. Mary asked one of the Sisters to attend to this gentleman, but she found the task too repugnant. In the end Mary herself combed his hair and beard and took him elsewhere for further attention.

As Mary sent her Sisters out to visit jails, the hospitals and reformatory, she encouraged them to see the goodness and potential in every person and in their encounters with others, to keep an open heart to all.

At Mary's beatification, Pope St John Paul II recalled:

Her story reminds us of the need to welcome people, to reach out to the lonely, the bereft, the disadvantaged. To strive for the kingdom of God and his righteousness means to strive to see Christ in the stranger, to meet him in them and to help them to meet him in each one of us!
