In addition to education, the sisters also offered their convent as a holiday home for the Sisters, especially those living in the Goldfields and other remote locations. Classes began in 1922 at 'Villa Carlotta' and then at the school in Prince Street. Bushies and Motor Missions operated from Busselton and in the early years, the Sisters accompanied the Parish Priest as he visited outlying areas as part of his ministry. Thank you to those pioneering women who have shaped the lives of many in the South West area of the state.

Leadership 2022 and Beyond Webinar

*Companions from all over the world discussed the role of leadership as we nurture the Josephite Spirit and make a difference as a part of a larger, worldwide movement. Sr Clare Conaglen rsj, the keynote speaker, led us to a greater understanding of leadership within the Josephite Companion Movement. There was a lot of information about servant leadership and how it does not mean being a ‘doormat, pushover or being taken advantage of’. One of the greatest messages was that **the potential for leadership is in all of us**. We are simply asked to, “bring what you have” and in realising the potential of ‘The Charism’ we are participating in God’s mission.*

We continue God’s Mission with a Josephite Heart. God’s mission for us is to give the message of God’s unbounded love for ALL creation with a tenderness that never disappoints. A Josephite Heart takes the humility of Joseph, a discerning heart that listens. We look to the role of Mary and Joseph as they cared for Jesus. Mary MacKillop cared for others with courage as her compass and Julian Tenison Woods, with his missionary spirit, his admiration for creation and his preaching of the message.

We had several opportunities to consider the attributes of good leaders and discern these qualities in Mary MacKillop and Julian Tenison Woods. Reporting back covered many different viewpoints including; humility, courage, shared vision, passion, commitment to the future, proficiency as a listener and a communicator, trust, conviction, integrity, recognition of the gifts of others, meeting the challenges of the times, emotional intelligence, flexibility, has charism, resilience, inclusivity, responsibility...
