Micah lived in times not unlike our own where there was much upheaval. The population was divided between the "haves" and the "have nots". Corruption in public life was rife. As a prophet, Micah was missioned to call out God's people. He berates them after reminding them of all God has done for them and he asks the question, "What does God ask of you? Three things only – to live justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8) These are not aspirations but actions, actions that we also are called to.

Live Justly

In order to fulfil this injunction we need to do more than profess to love God and our neighbour. We need to acknowledge and be aware of the injustices in our close and wider communities. Like our patron, St Joseph, we should be fair and just in all we do and find ways to support those who actively work towards justice for those who are treated unfairly, discriminated against, judged and condemned on the basis of colour, religion, health status or ethnicity. Following in Jesus' example, we should embrace "the least of these", those neglected and despised by society.

Love Tenderly

To love tenderly is to be like God, to love with kindness. Our love for God is seen in our love for others and is built on love and kindness. This is beautifully expressed in the prayer of St Francis:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

None of us is perfect, yet God loves us. To love tenderly is to show mercy, understanding and compassion to others without judgement, realising that we know nothing of their life struggles. We should strive to be open, aware of peoples' circumstances and make allowances for them as God does for us. St Paul reminds the early Christians, "Be friends with one another, and kind, forgiving each other as God forgave you, in Christ" (Eph 4;32).

Walk Humbly

To walk with someone implies a connection, a closeness. To walk with God is to acknowledge the truth about ourselves, admitting that we depend on Him and need a personal relationship with Him. Through prayer we develop that relationship and learn to trust in God's love for us, allowing Him to guide us, knowing that all will be well.

"With God on our side, what need we fear?" Mary MacKillop 1890

By living justly, loving tenderly and walking humbly with God we are not just doing what the Lord asks of us: we are on the path to a meaningful and blessed life following in the footsteps and spirituality of Mary MacKillop and Julian Tenison Woods.

Companion, encourage and enfold us in the fulness of divine love.
