 St. Francis' Church was the first Catholic Church in Melbourne. After three years in a temporary chapel, Mass was celebrated in the new (unfurnished) St. Francis on Sunday, 22nd May, 1842. It was October, 1845, before the building was completed. In December, 1970, the National Trust of Australia gave it an "A" classification for It "remains the only central city public building dating from the era before the gold rush still standing on its original site, still serving its original function and still retaining its original form".
