It was a fabulous opportunity to gather with like minded people and develop a deeper understanding of Liturgy.



LEARNING ABOUT LAUDATO SI

Companions were moved by Sr Christine Clarke's explanation of Pope Francis' eloquent Encyclical Letter. In this encyclical, Pope Francis calls nature a “constant source of wonder and awe” and “a continuing revelation of the divine”. Laudato Si is a poem of praise but also a powerful prophetic document calling each and every person to a global ecological conversion. It is a text that should be reflected on and discussed with others in order to deepen awareness of what we are being called to do at this moment in the history of the universe. We thank Sister Christine pbvm for her insightful presentation and her deep conviction that every person has the responsibility to heed the call for environmental change. She emphasised the need to work together to bring about this change. As individuals we cannot hope to succeed, rather, we need to find strength in numbers and organisations that are dedicated and committed to planet health. We can open the doors of communication and expand our circles of concern and influence. Many thanks too, to Sr Pauline and core group members who helped to make this day a success.



Josephite Companions, led by Sr Mary Ann Casanova rsj, Sr Kathleen Hitchcock rsj and Sr Pauline Dundon rsj met in June to consider a meaningful response to Pope Francis' moral call to action on climate change, ecological sustainability and a global human ethic. We participated in a webinar based on the Josephite response to Laudato Si—Explore ~Embrace~ Embody.

Be an advocate for change!

- Join a letter writing group such as the NSW Josephite Writing Rings for Righting Wrongs.
- Add your name to the call for the banning of single-use plastic bags: Petition: Ban Single-Use Plastics in Australia! (marineconservation.org.au)
- Keep up with the progress toward an international treaty on plastics.
- Support the peoples of the Pacific in the fight for climate safety and justice. Information and a petition is available on the Australia Pacific Greenpeace website.

- Consider the LONGTERM impacts of industries and individual items – disposable nappies and unrecycled toothbrushes ‘LIVE’ for 500 years.
- Reduce energy consumption by switching off lights, appliances and computers when not in use.
- Use products made from recycled materials such as toilet paper and printer paper.
- Use biodegradable detergent in the kitchen and laundry.
- Be aware of food wastage—make a conscious effort to reduce food waste.
- Avoid buying fruit and vegetables that are pre– packaged in plastic.

Our prayer on the day focused on Fr Julian Tenison Woods, Josephite co-founder with Mary MacKillop. Both Mary and Julian expressed and shared a deep love and appreciation for the beauty and wonder of earth.

Sr Pauline and Sr Kathleen led the session after morning tea where we had the opportunity to write acrostic poems to express our understanding of the document and our response to Laudato Si.
