Editorial...

I am the vine: you are the branches

As I write this editorial, I'm grieving the loss of a young married man, husband, father to 6 children and heavily involved in life and living. He and his family grew up in a close relationship with our family and particularly with our children; a relationship that changed this week with his death from cancer. For all intents and purposes, that relationship can never be the same living, dynamic that it once was, but I doubt it will ever truly end. Graham's spirit will remain with all of us into the future. We can never touch him or speak with him as previously, but we cannot stop believing that Graham's earthly life may have ended at 46, but he will continue to live on forever with his God. It is for this reason that we view death in a different light.

Jesus will never stop loving us. Love is the reason he chose to live as one of us. As God, he had nothing to prove; but as a lover, he needed to show how much he loves and to seek our love in return. That's the absolutely amazing truth! That Jesus wants to share his love with us, just as we are, and that he yearns for us to love him in return.

We have many images that might describe that love to us; Emmanuel – God with us, Good Shepherd, Healer and Restorer, Calmer of Storms, Messiah, True Light, and ultimately, Saviour, who was prepared to die for us. One image that is particularly in my mind at present is Jesus Christ as "living vine" particularly in light of Graham's death. In John 15, Jesus assures us that he is the source of life and that he can bring new growth to the vine and even cause it to bear fruit. If we can remain close to Jesus, then we too take on the



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

Let's try to take advantage of the common bonds we share as Josephite Companions, and endeavour to connect with each other to make our branches bear even more fruit.

Prayer/Reflection

Jesus said: "I am the vine, you are the branches" John 15

Jesus, your life-giving spirit has flowed within me from the moment of my conception. You loved me into being. You filled my spirit and my body with your love. I thank you that I am so wonderfully made. I am connected to you with eternal bonds and your love courses within me.

You speak of that love when you remind me that you are the vine, the eternal source of life and energy. Amazingly, you also invite me into that life-giving energy. All goodness and fruitfulness flows from you. If I remain attached to you, the vine, I have the capacity to be life-giving too. Your life flows through me and is destined to be a source of energy for others. Every true branch carries the DNA of the vine, and seeks to further the love it carries.

How often do I stop to reflect on that? How does my life mirror your love and your grace? What actions do I take to ensure the life energy you have given me is also available to others? How do I ensure your love flows out from me? Your vine is intended to bear much fruit and each branch has the capacity to bear that same fruit.

My branch is intended to be joined with other branches to increase the scope and yield of the vine. How can this happen? As a Josephite Companion, what steps can I take to ensure that my particular branch of this vine experiences connection with other branches of the same vine? Distance probably affects my contact with other Companion branches, but distance can be overcome. Mary MacKillop never allowed distance to separate her from her sisters. Remember how important she thought communication was. She travelled enormous distances, but she also relied on the written word. Her letters are legendary. I'm fortunate that I join with a group of Companions who meet locally on a regular basis, and I truly appreciate the friendship, support and prayer they provide me, but this is not an option for everyone. Could e-Companioning be available more widely? Could it be helpful to you?

What steps can I take to enable the life-giving energy flow I experience be evident and available to others? How does my life reflect this gift?
