RECONCILIATION WEEK

The dates for National Reconciliation Week remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey – the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

As Josephite Companions we are called to allow Reconciliation to live in our hearts, minds and actions as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

We all have a role to play when it comes to Reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures, and futures.

This year's theme, "Bridging Now to Next" focuses on the ongoing connection between the past, present and future. Significant events of the past, for example, Corroboree 2000, brought together Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous leaders in a historic call for Reconciliation. We continue that work, inviting all Australians to come together as one in *Bridging Now to Next* – building a more united and respectful nation.

JOSEPHITE COMPANION MOVEMENT CHARTER AND AUSPICE AGREEMENT

On the Feast of St Joseph, 19 March 2025, a significant milestone was reached for the Josephite Companion Movement with the signing of the Josephite Companion Movement Charter and the Auspice Agreement by the Congregational Leadership Team and the Josephite Companion Leadership Team (JCoLT)

What These Documents Represent

1. The Charter

The Charter articulates the identity, mission, and values of the Josephite Companions. It affirms their commitment to living the charism of Saint Mary MacKillop and Father Julian Tenison Woods through:

Friendship

Prayer

Service

It defines who the Companions are and how they seek to embody the Josephite spirit in their daily lives, both individually and collectively.

2. The Auspice Agreement

This formal agreement outlines the relationship between the Josephite Companion Movement and the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart. It sets clear expectations and responsibilities for both parties, ensuring mutual support and accountability as the movement continues to grow and evolve. Specific grievance and code of conduct policies are included.

A Step into the Future

This dual signing marks a transformative step forward for the movement. It provides a codified framework for how the Josephite Companions will operate, collaborate, and sustain their mission. It also ensures that the movement remains aligned with the values and vision of the Sisters of Saint Joseph while maintaining its own unique identity and autonomy.

Global Reach and Local Impact

The Josephite Companion Movement is active not only in Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand but also in places like Peru, Timor Leste, and Scotland. The Charter and Agreement will guide all these communities in their shared journey of living the gospel with a Josephite heart

JUNE DARDANUP JOSEPHITE COMPANION GATHERING

Companions were given the opportunity to discuss the Charter and the Auspice Agreement at the June gathering in Bunbury. The challenge is to embrace the documents in their entirety and plan for the future of our movement as an unincorporated arm of the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart.
