

Travelling Sisters' Roadshow ...

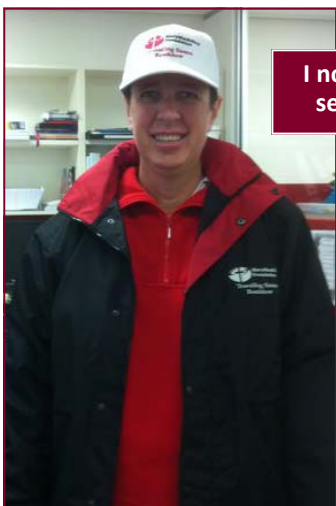
The Travelling Sisters' Roadshow is a educational initiative of the Mary MacKillop Foundation, created to assist small life changing projects.
